Preparing **Public Health** Emergency



Emergency preparedness is a key element in the City of Eden Prairie's commitment to the prevention of, and response to, emergencies, disasters and acts of terrorism.

or this reason, the Eden Prairie Police and Fire Departments will be assisting the **Hennepin County** Public Health Department with a mass dispensing drill that will take place the morning of Sunday, May 4 in the parking lot of Eden Prairie Center.

The goal of this drill is to test the effectiveness of methods for distributing a medication or vaccine to a large group of people in a short period of time during a public health emergency.

"Rapidly dispensing medication to an entire community can effectively curtail some infectious disease outbreaks before they become widespread," explained Alisa Johnson with the Hennepin County Public Health Department. "The mass dispensing drill in Eden Prairie will test one option we are currently considering for accomplishing this."

The method being tested is a drive-through system that would essentially dispense medication to an entire household via a drive-up dispensing station. If successful, this method could be utilized by Hennepin County in a public health emergency to distribute a mass amount of medication without requiring residents to leave their cars.

On Sunday, May 4, the City of Eden Prairie and Hennepin County are asking the public to participate in the mass dispensing drill by driving through the JCPenney parking lot at Eden Prairie Center (8251 Flying Cloud Drive) between 8:45 and 10 a.m.

Participation will take approximately 30 minutes and will involve driving through one of several dispensing stations where Hennepin County Public Health officials will distribute a "test medication" in the form of M&M® candies. Participants will also receive gift bags filled with coupons and giveaways from Eden Prairie Center merchants.

proughout the month of April and into early May, the Eden Prairie Utilities Division will perform a flushing and maintenance check on all City fire hydrants.


This process involves opening and exercising each of

he City Council took a big step last night toward advancing the City's 20-40-15 initiative by approving a plan prepared by the City's energy management consultant, McKinstry & Associates, which will increase the energy

efficiency of the City's public buildings.

The plan, which we call Phase 1.1, includes improvements to the lighting and electrical controls at the City Center, Community Center, Streets & Parks Maintenance Center and three other city buildings. The cost of the projects is estimated to be \$860,000. The City will secure the cost of the project through a Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP) contract with McKinstry. The blended simple payback period for the projects is 12

One of the more interesting aspects of the plan is how it's financed. The projects are financed with debt that is repaid by the money saved by the City through lower energy costs attributable to the projects themselves. Our agreement with McKinstry guarantees sufficient energy cost savings to pay the

project costs — or they will make up the difference, so they have a stake in making sure that what they recommended will actually work. That seems like a good idea to me.

> We call the project Phase 1.1 because there are additional projects for other public buildings under development that we will present to the Council for approval in the near future. We're also working on a plan to show the Council how the 20-40-15 initiative is playing out in our vehicle fleet as well.

The Phase 1.1 projects approved by the Council last night will reduce the amount of carbon dioxide produced by the city government operations of the City of Eden Prairie by 625 metric tons per year. That's pretty good, but we can do better — and we will.
