


Flying Cloud Noise Reports January and February 2007

Spike in Complaints in February Driven by Helicopter Operations


Details

- 90 complaints for Jan – Feb period
- Spike mostly in Feb
- 16 different Complainants
- 48 overall for 10pm-7am operations
- 39 specifically said "Helicopter" noise

Why the Up tick in Helicopter Noise?

Spike in Complaints in Feb

- Just began Flying Cloud operations
 - Bell 206 and Bell 222*
 helicopters based at FCM
- About 60 flights per month from Flying Cloud
- Training began in Feb
 - Training every six months
- Operations 24 x 7 x 365
- Crews on standby (Pilot, Nurse, EMT)

LifeLink III and Air Methods

- LifeLink III contracts with Air Methods
- Air Methods provides air medical transportation services
- Mission: Transport people needing intensive medical care from either the scene of an accident or from general care hospitals to trauma centers or tertiary care centers.
- System-wide completed more than 350,000 air medical missions since 1980
 - Heart-related issues
 - Premature child issues
 - 30% involve medical teams
 - 10% of the flights go to the accident site

- Air Methods is willing to brief the City Council at its April 17 meeting






Next Steps
