Kathy Nelson was elected in 2018 to her fourth four-year term as a member of the City Council. Her current term ends Dec. 31, 2022.



## **Property Valuation**

n March, residential property owners received a Hennepin County 2019 Property Tax Statement based on the 2018 assessment indicating taxes due this year, and a 2019 Notice of Valuation and Classification indicating property values used as a basis for taxes due in 2020.

The Assessing Division maintains Eden Prairie property records and adjusts the market values based on actual real estate sales on comparable properties from the past year.

#### A Message from the **City Manager**




#### **OVERALL QUALITY OF LIFE**





Percentages represent ratings of "excellent" or "good"


### OVERALL CONCLUSIONS

## Recreational Fire Guidelines

eneral recreational fire guidelines in Eden Prairie include:

- Maximum size of 3-by-3 feet
- Must be at least 25 feet from any combustible structures such as homes, sheds, decks or fences
- Only wood with minimum 1-inch diameter may be burned
- Fires permitted between 7 a.m. and midnight
- Fires allowed when wind is less than 15 miles per hour
- Any fire or police officer may withdraw permission for recreational fires

A copy of the detailed recreational fire guidelines available online or from the Fire Department serves as your permit and must be on-site.


