Water the Plants, Not the Weeds!

Weeds! Ugh! If it is a good year for your garden plants to grow - that also means it is a good year for weeds to grow! But they just grow faster!

How do you keep the weeds from ruining your garden?

- 1. Rack or Hoe between the garden plants. Get those little sprouts of weeds before they take over! There is no replacement for **constant 'weeding'** your garden. But a little time spent in the spring will mean you won't have to spend lots of time in the middle of the summer.
- 2. Water only your garden plants don't spray the entire area. It take a bit more time to carefully water only your plants, but it pays off later. **Don't water the weeds!**
- 3. **Mulch**. With the right mulch you can conserve soil moisture, improve soil fertility, and reduce weed growth.
