Recreational Fire Guidelines

eneral recreational fire guidelines in Eden Prairie include:

- Maximum size of 3-by-3 feet
- Must be at least 25 feet from structures such as homes, sheds, decks or fences
- Fires shall be attended while burning
- A means to extinguish the fire must be kept nearby
- Only wood with minimum 1-inch diameter may be burned
- Fires permitted between 7 a.m. and midnight
- Fires allowed when wind is less than 15 miles per hour
- Any fire or police officer may withdraw permission for recreational fires

A copy of Eden Prairie's detailed recreational fire guidelines, available online or from the **Fire Department**, serves as your permit and must be on-site.

SWLRT CONSTRUCTION

Summer 2021 Outlook

onstruction along the **Southwest LRT Green Line Extension** has progressed throughout the winter with ongoing activity around SouthWest Station, the new LRT Bridge at I-494/Flying Cloud Drive and Golden Triangle Station.

This summer, construction will focus on these areas:

- Ongoing construction of the SouthWest Station platform and parking structure
- Prairie Center Drive bridge railing and track installation
- Town Center Station platform construction and new Town Center Place cul-de-sac construction from Eden Road to the station
- Roadwork along Flying Cloud Drive between Town Center Place and Valley View Road
- Bridge approaches for the Valley View Road bridge
- Completion of West 70th Street track crossing and roadway work
- Completion of remaining Shady Oak Road Bridge piers and abutment, as well as setting bridge beams over Hwy. 212 and to the abutment
- Completion of south half of Hwy. 62 tunnel along with retaining walls around City West Station
- Beginning work at City West Station
- Track work and landscaping throughout corridor

Managing Yard Waste

hen the snow melts, runoff on your street washes through storm sewers and into local lakes, ponds and rivers, carrying yard waste and other pollutants. Proper disposal of yard waste helps protect the health of local waterways.

Options for managing yard waste include curbside pick-up available through most trash haulers, using a local drop-off site or composting in your backyard. The new **Eden Prairie Yard Waste Site** (9811 Flying Cloud Dr.) is available to residents April through November!

Pet waste also contains nutrients that promote weed and algae growth, turning waterbodies into a mucky, smelly mess. By picking up dog waste, on public and private property, you can help keep our recreation areas clean, safe and beautiful (City Code Chapter 9.2).




Water Conservation Rebates
